



What a busy time we have had at Sturt over the past two weeks. Last week we celebrated Education Week and Book Week combined under the theme of "Today's schools creating tomorrow's future". Our STEM night was a huge success with nearly 160 parents and grandparents attending the STEM presentation and nearly 200 students involved in the STEM activities. The positive feedback was overwhelming as parents could see first-hand the engagement with learning and the emphasis on authentic problem solving. I would like to congratulate Mrs Livio and Mrs Hawkins who have led this work, influencing and supporting not only our own staff but also schools across the state. I would also like to thank the teachers who facilitated the STEM activities led by Miss Wood and Miss Curry. Miss Jones, Miss Holt, Mrs Mott, Mrs Gooden, Mrs Ingram and Mr Ward assisted students with activities that were both challenging and fun.

Acacia 2017 & Waratah 2018 (Mrs Livio) have developed their STEM project around recycling. In 2018, they are joined by Banksia (Miss Curry) and Darling (Miss Brasier) in this journey. Darling is also venturing into healthy diets and Wombat is working with the veggie garden. Lachlan (Opportunity Class with Mrs Hawkins) has created their STEM project in conjunction with the Riverina Museum and their research areas have been very extensive. As a result, six of our students were invited to present their Museum project on behalf of their teams, at the Powerhouse Museum last Friday. We are thrilled with the expanding STEM work happening in our school under the banner of "Sturt Cares". I will be travelling with Mrs Livio and Mrs Hawkins to Sydney on Friday for the Australian Education Awards night, of which our school is a finalist in the STEM project section.

Education Week also gave opportunities for our dance group and concert band to perform. Both did a superb job with very positive feedback from the audience. Thank you to Miss Rose and Mr Lothian for training these two groups. Thank you also to Mrs Ingram for her role as staff liaison with the concert band and organisation of this excursion.

Our Book Fair was a huge success, thank you to the parents who supported this and to Mrs Nelson for her organisation of this event. The profits will go towards purchasing more books for our library. Our Book Parade finished a busy week with students and staff entering into the spirit of the day. Thank you to the huge numbers of families who came to support their children on such a happy day. The sausage sizzle was a perfect follow on and thank you Mrs Klimpsch for organising this with the help of some parents and Kooringal High School students.

### **School Readiness Program**

Our School Readiness program has begun with visits from Good Start Wagga and Station Place, along with St Lukes.

The feedback was very positive with the preschool teachers working with our teachers and the students participating in skills based activities to ensure the children's readiness for school. Thank you to Mrs Ryan, Mrs Rees and Mrs Gooden for running this program. It will continue until Week 9 after which our Sturt Kindergarten Orientation Program will begin.

### Part 2

### **Early Bedtimes**

Sleep is the building blocks for healthy brain development. It helps us process the day's events and learn from it. Children's brains are constantly developing and creating new neural connections. They absolutely must get sleep to nurture these connections.

Between children's activities, school and always squeezing in technology time, children are going to bed later and having a difficult time settling before sleep. One of the most basic things you can do for your child's behaviour, health and well-being is to help them get the sleep that they need.

### Empathy

What do children really need to be happy and successful? The answer surprises most: **Empathy**. It is the trait that allows us to "walk in another person's shoes".

Though children are hard wired to care, they aren't born empathetic, just like they aren't born to order a latte at the coffee shop. It's a learned behaviour!

Empathy promotes kindness, prosocial behaviours, moral courage, and it is an effective antidote to bullying, aggression, prejudice and racism.


## KINDERGARTEN 2019
