PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES

Road Safety

As parents would be aware, there was an accident on Friday 5th June when one of our students was hit by a car as he was walking across Lake Albert Road with his mother and his younger brother. Fortunately, the student escaped any major injuries however the driver of the car was naturally extremely upset. I would like to acknowledge Mrs Abby Murray, Mrs Angela Becroft and Mrs Fiona Belford for their quick actions at the scene along with one of our parents, Mrs Nikki Sellick who was able to assist.

It does serve as a timely reminder of how important it is to follow road rules and cross the road at the crossings. To ensure road safety, please note that parents picking their children up from the Lake Albert Rd gate (who are not parked on the school side of Lake Albert Rd), need to exit the school via the White Ave gate crossing, to ensure that our students are crossing at the safest spot. We work very hard to teach students the safest way to cross the road and it is important for parents to be teaching their children the same thing. It is also important that students being picked up in the afternoons at these crossings, are picked up at the correct time.

We are well aware that dropping off children in the mornings and picking them up in the afternoons is always a challenge, given limited parking and the narrowness of White Ave and Kilpatrick St. The road rules however still remain the same. Parking across the driveway or crossing of a morning, to let children out of the car, is not allowed. Parents are urged to take great care to keep their eyes on what is happening. Students can be unpredictable and we need your help in keeping them as safe as possible around this time of day. The school has had a number of reports of unsafe driving along White Avenue and we need your help to keep our students safe.

Children under the age of 10 must always hold the hand of an adult when crossing the road and cars must wait while children are crossing the road at the correct crossing areas. We are concerned that there are a

number of cars not giving way and not waiting for the students to cross the road.

We have also had a number of concerns raised by the community about our students not riding scooters to and from school safely. We have given the students a warning about safe riding, however, if this continues we will need to ban scooters at school.

Kindergarten enrolments

Sturt Public School is now accepting enrolments for Kindergarten 2021. Early indication of intention to enrol allows for a more accurate future School Planning Process. If you live in the Sturt Enrolment Zone you are able to enrol in our school by completing an Enrolment Form and providing documentation such as a Birth Certificate, Proof of Address, Immunisation details and Health Care Plans. NSW Public School Finder (online) is available to check if you are in zone for Sturt Public School. Unfortunately, we are unable to take any out of zone enrolments from new families.
